Zero Waste Men's Basketball Game

- Participated in Pac-12 Zero Waste Challenge in Pauley Pavilion
 - Set up system of manned and unmanned waste stations
 - Sorted through trash bags to determine percentage of contamination
- Discovered large amount of food concessions thrown away that were unopened and untouched
- We ended up diverting 94.7% of the waste produced

 Food waste produced: 31 hot dog buns, 84 pretzels, 60 hot dogs, 40 pounds of shredded mozzarella cheese, 48 pre-baked pizza shells, 40 pounds of coke cups

- 91.9% of students are *interested* or *extremely interested* in UCLA Athletics becoming more sustainable
- Interest in increased sustainability actions is greater than concern for environmental impact of athletic events
- 91.1% of students would be willing to pay at least \$1 extra per concession item
- Sustainability strategies...
 - Biodegradable packaging
 - Reusable items (bringing in water bottles, souvenir cups)

Student Survey Bias

- · A sample size that is not representative of the overall undergraduate student population
- Opt in nature of survey creates bias
 - people who are taking it have some level of sustainability interest; could be mitigated with higher number of respondents

ASUCLA

- · Challenges of navigating through this bureaucracy...
 - Policy recommendation—learning to use particular language
 - Scheduling complications and finding the appropriate contacts
- · Certain products are harder to deal with
